The Ministry of Health and Social Protection (MHSP), and the Department of National Planning (DNP), made data available to us. When the MHSP made part of the Ministry of Social Protection (MSP), it used to be directly involved with the SENA, the entity in charge of administrating the *Jovenes en Acción* program, the one under evaluation in the article, by sitting in its Board of Directors. In 2011, the MSP was split into the MHSP and the Ministry of Labor, and ever since, it is the Ministry of Labor the one directly related to SENA, not the MHSP nor the DNP.

Statutory Law number 1581 of October 2012, imposed several constraints on the possibility to share information that does not allow us to share it. The *Banco de la República de Colombia* has an agreement with the MHSP that allows the interchange of data, but explicitly constraints the Bank from redistributing the data received from the MHSP. Anyone interested in the formal employment data can require it at the MHSP, while the *Jovenes en Acción* program evaluation and the SISBEN data can both be required to DNP.
