

**Disclosure Statement for Andrew Beath for the paper “Can Development Programs Counter Insurgencies? Evidence from a Field Experiment in Afghanistan”**

The collection and processing of household survey data analyzed by the article was financed by the Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, which implemented the National Solidarity Program.

Funding for the design and supervision of household survey data collection was provided by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO).

Funding for the design and supervision of household survey data collection was also provided by the World Bank, which provided grants to the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan to partially fund the costs of implementing the National Solidarity Program.

The study received IRB approval from the Committee on the Use of Human Subjects (CUHS) of Harvard University (protocol number F14833) and from the Committee on the Use of Humans as Experimental Subjects (COUHES) at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (protocol number 1102004359).
